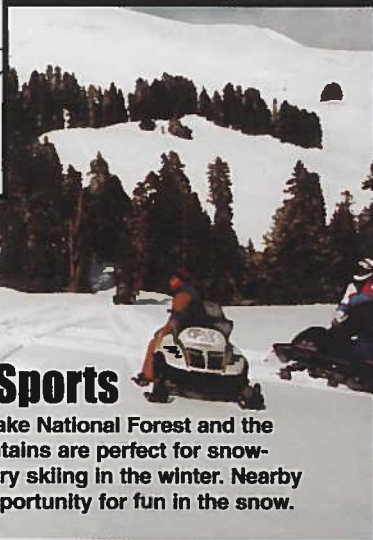


Paiute ATV Trail

The Paiute ATV trail is a 272 mile loop that crosses mountain ranges, rugged canyons and deserts. It is one of the premier ATV adventures in the world with varying trail types to meet everyone's experience. Enter the trail from any point; there is no beginning and no end. All towns in Piute County and Otter Creek and Piute State Parks have easy trail access. In addition, each town along the trail allows ATVs on designated streets so riders can go directly from the trail to local businesses. Mountain bikers are also welcome. 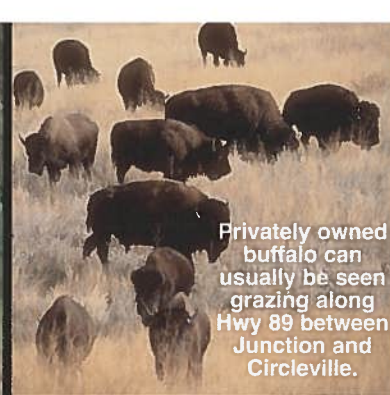
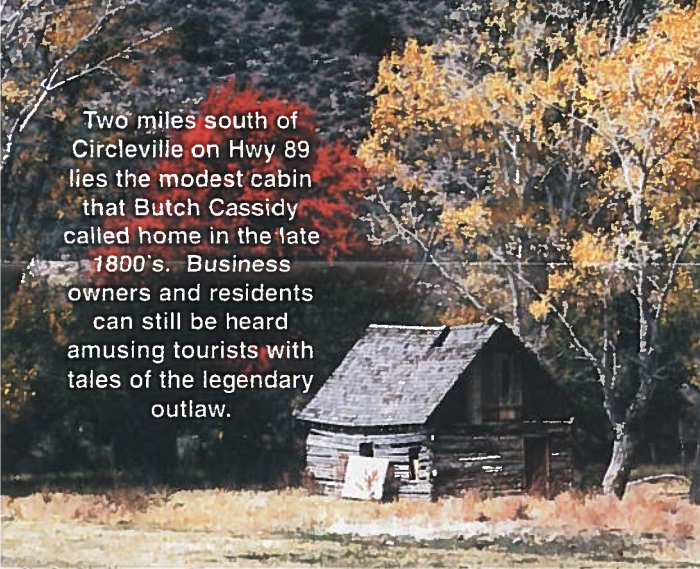


Winter Sports

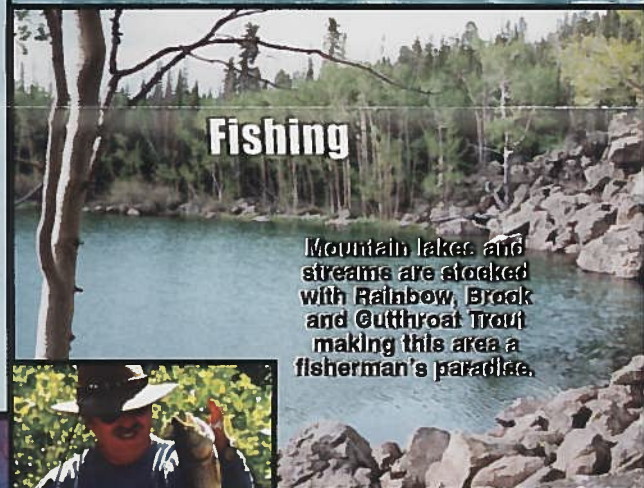
Boating & Water Sports

Boating and a variety of water sports at Otter Creek and Piute Reservoirs will satisfy just about anyone's need for excitement.



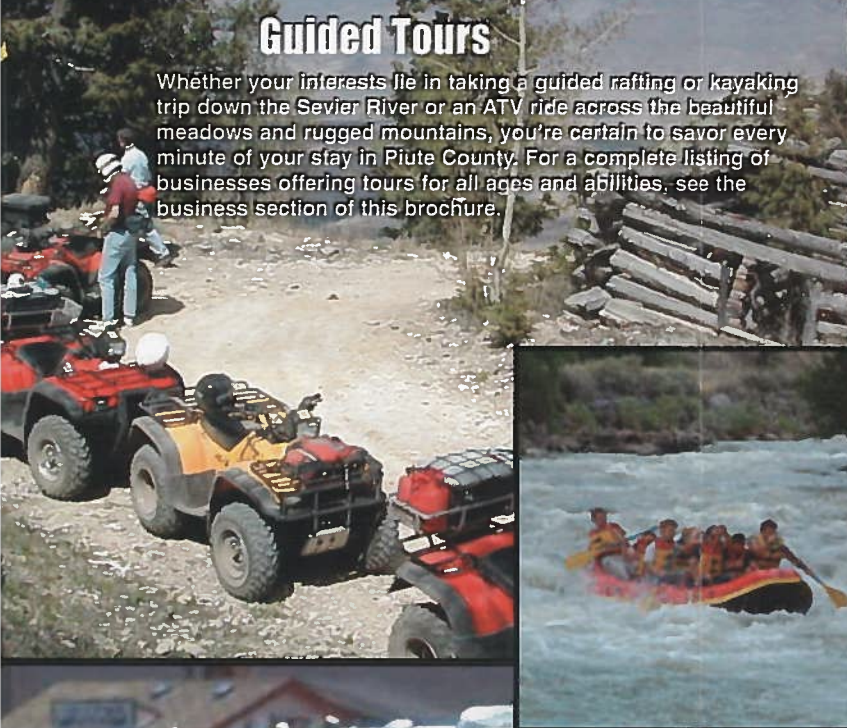
Fishing

Mountain lakes and streams are stocked with Rainbow, Brook and Cutthroat Trout making this area a fisherman's paradise.



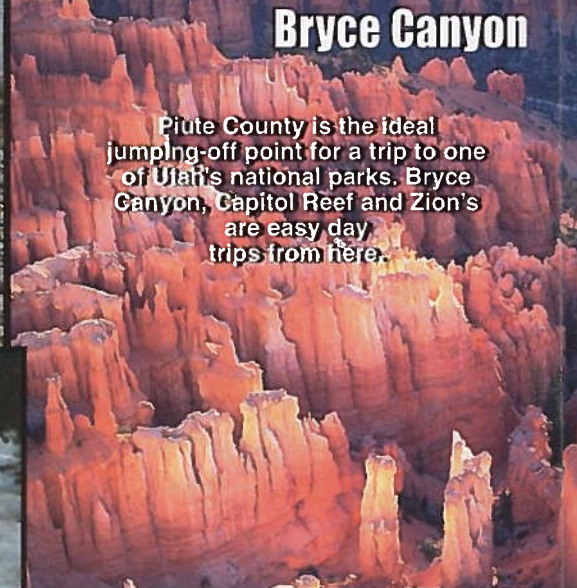
Guided Tours

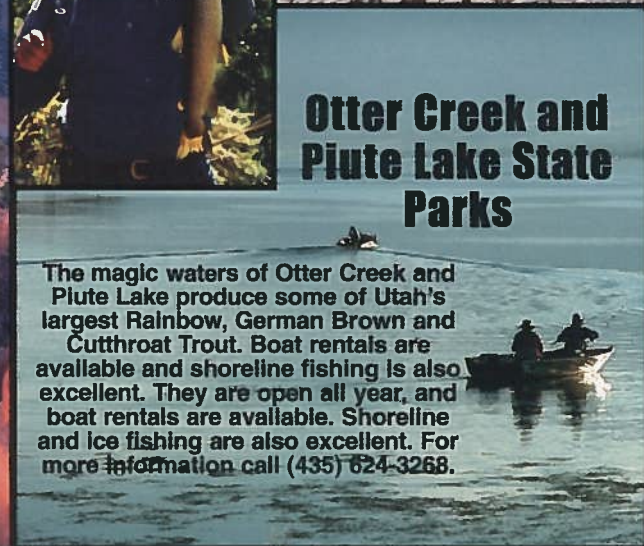
Bryce Canyon

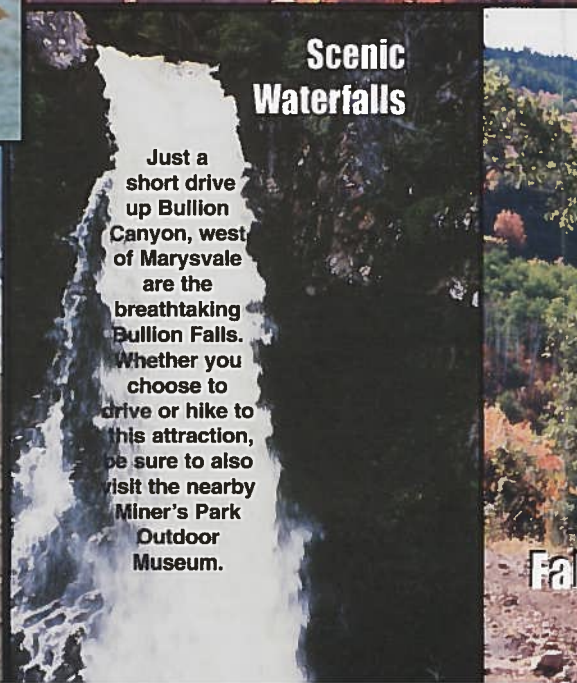
Otter Creek and Piute Lake State Parks

Our Heritage

Piute County is rich in heritage that can be seen and felt by all. Located in the center of Utah's Heritage Hwy 89, a 250 mile tour through Mormon colonization history, visitors can see distinctive remains of early western history.

Mining was once a booming industry that is now gone, but today you can immerse ourself in a mining heritage of abandoned mines and tales of lost gold. Be certain to reserve some time to take the 2.5 mile "Canyon of Gold Driving Tour" that starts at the Fishlake National Forest boundary in Bullion Canyon west of Marysvale. A brochure, available at the trailhead, interprets ten historic mining features including old mill sites, mines, remnants of an 1870's toll road, and an arrastra which may have been used by the Spanish to extract gold from ore. The highlight of the tour is the Miners' Park. An easy, quarter-mile trail winds around interpretive displays of authentic late 1800 and early 1900 mining equipment, a fully furnished cabin, a mine portal and shaft, a picnic area and restrooms. Take another short drive or hike to view the breathtaking Bullion Falls. If you catch the gold bug yourself, go panning in Bullion Creek and look for your own pot of Gold.

Piute County is also home to a western legend. A modest cabin south of Circleville was the childhood home of Robert LeRoy Parker, alias Butch Cassidy. If you stop by a local café or business, there's a good chance you will hear stories about Butch from the local folk.

Local shops offer the chance to not only see a bit of history, but to take it home as well. Purchase an array of heritage items that may include antiques, quilts, crafts, log furniture or authentic barn wood frames all lovingly handcrafted by our skilled, local artisans. Other heritage experiences include visiting historic sites or touring Utah's oldest hotel, Moore's Old Pine Inn. See the back page for a complete listing of businesses.
